Secretariat Update

The CG were briefed on the ISSU's 2022 budget and briefly discussed potential plans for upcoming events in the year.

Stand Against Direct Provision Coalition

ISSU has been invited to join STAD, which is made up of civil society organisations campaigning against Direct Provision. ISSU is against Direct Provision.

The Coiste Gnó voted unanimously to join

Nomination for the National Youth Assembly

Due to the timing of the National Youth Assembly 18 month term,

The Coiste Gnó unanimously voted to nominate the Uachtarán to the DCEDIY's National Youth Assembly of Ireland, a consultative forum which will be discussing key issues in the coming 18 months

If the nomination is successful, the seat can be carried over into their term as Uachtarán Oinigh,

There will be consultation within ISSU in advance of every meeting as they have set topics.

CG/ROB Meetings

The Rúnaí has designed a new structure for joint meetings between the Coiste Gnó and Regional Officer Body to improve the meetings and relations between the CG and ROB.

The Coiste Gnó approved the questions for the Education Officer's survey on the Leaving Cert Applied

ISSU Covid/State Exams Survey

A full report on the results is being drafted and will be released as soon as it is finished.

A press release on the state examinations was issued late last night (16/01/22) while the report is being drafted, the findings show: 68% of leaving cycle students are calling for a hybrid model for state examinations in 2022 and just under 64% of junior cycle students favour either a hybrid model or just calculated grading. 1 in 3 senior cycle students in Ireland answered the survey (18,981 individuals).

1 in 7 junior cycle students in Ireland answered the survey (8,329 individuals).

The International Officer has been receiving questions about the exam booklets for accounting as they don't have enough space to complete certain accounts.
